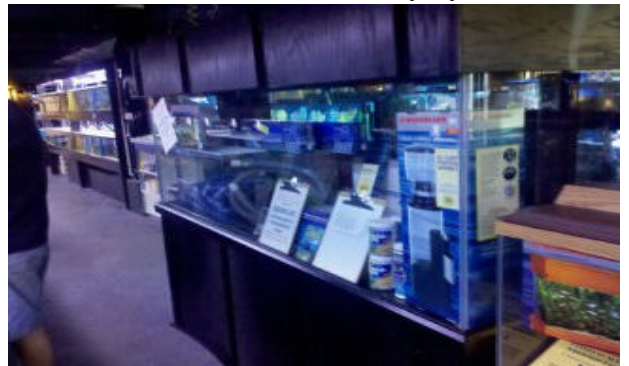

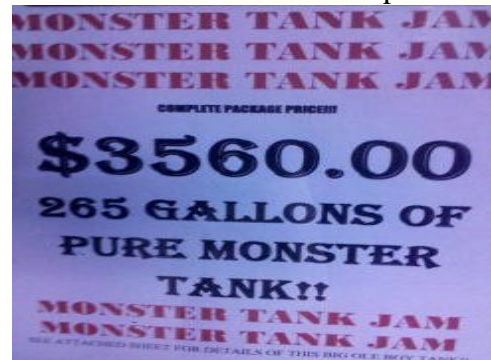

THE SEASON IS CHANGING...

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO

First we had the most evil winter we have seen in many years. Then we were fooled with a nice long spring. But we were all awakened by this miserably HOT summer that seemed would never end. Well it's over! And with the change in the season, you need to pay attention to both your aquarium and outdoor pond.

AQUARIUMS....

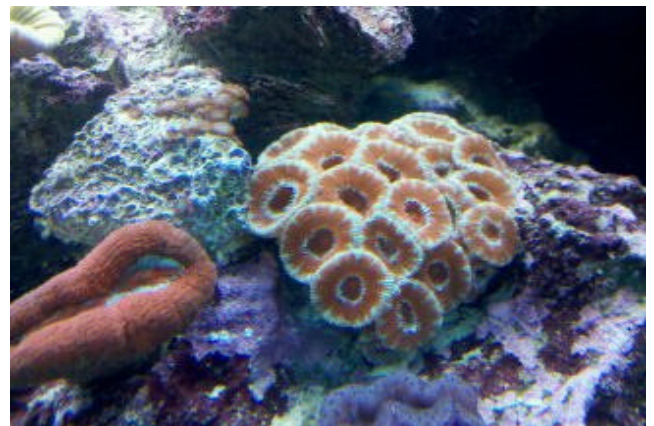
Each year around this time we start seeing our fish medication section getting great attention from customers. Why? Because this is the time of year that many aquariums develop disease issues due to sudden changes in the aquarium water temperature. Many folks open up the windows at night to enjoy the cooler temps and to reduce their electric bills. But for the aquarium, this can lead to trouble. Stress to your fish due to swings in water temperature is one of the biggest reasons why fish get sick. Their weakened immune system leaves them vulnerable to all sorts of parasite diseases that if left untreated, further develop into secondary bacterial diseases. How do you prevent this? Aquarium owners should be checking the aquarium heater for proper operation and wattage size. The heater should be large enough to handle minor variations in room temperature compared with the aquarium water temperature. Test your heaters operation and setting by taking a look at your aquarium thermometer at three points – morning, mid-day and night. There should be no more than a 1 or 2 degree variation over this period. If there is a larger variation, you need to set the heater temperature to the proper level, add an additional heater or replace your malfunctioning heater – whichever is the case. Don't let your fish get sick from such a simple fix. Take the time to look at your aquarium thermometer to ensure the water temperature is remaining stable at all points during the day and night.....

GARDEN PONDS AND KOI PONDS....

This summer has been brutal to our ponds with huge algae blooms and dangerously hot pond water! Now things are cooling down and you will begin to notice pond plant leaves fading and tree leaves falling. If left in the pond, this will increase the organic load thus feeding more algae

next spring. This organic material is also acidic. It will reduce the ponds carbonate hardness (alkalinity) thus driving down the pH to possible dangerous levels. Cut out dying plant material and net out leaves. Covering your pond with netting can also trap leaf debris before it falls into your pond. This is also a good time to give your pond filter a good cleaning. Use well water, old pond water or dechlorinated tap water to clean accumulated debris from your ponds biological filter material. Do not flush this sludge into your pond. Many parasites find refuge in this material and make their way into your pond water if the sludge is flushed into the pond. The use of biological cleanup products like Aqualife Water Garden Cleaner will reduce any remaining sludge on the bottom of the pond and in pond filters. In mid to late October when night temperatures dip into the 60's, you should begin feeding your fish a wheat germ food. This will bulk up your fish to prepare them for their winter rest period. Wheat germ food is also processed by the fish quickly so as to not sour in the digestive tract of the fish.

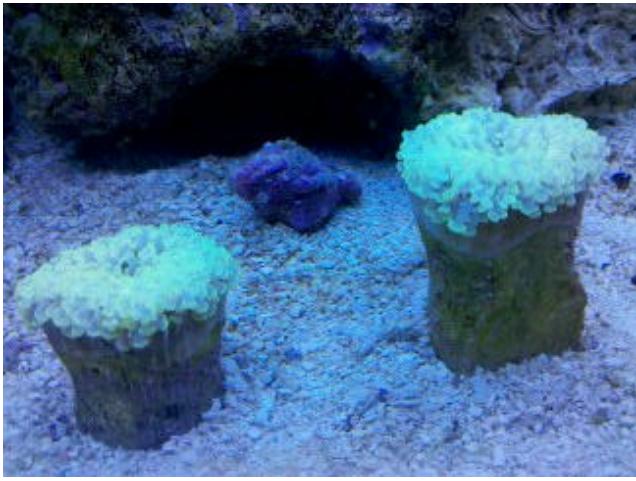
